CONSULTING SERVICES: DEVELOPMENT & DEPLOYMENT OF E-WORK PERMIT WEB APPLICATION FOR MINISTRY OF LABOR IN COLLABORATION WITH MOPT

The Government of Liberia has received a credit from the International Development Association of the World Bank “the Bank” towards the cost of the first phase of the West Africa Regional Communications Infrastructure Program (WARCIP) Liberia Project. The objectives of WARCIP Liberia are to increase the reach and reduce the cost of telecommunications in Liberia.

Under its institutional strengthening and enabling environment component, WARCIP Liberia provides support to the Liberia Ministry of Posts & Telecommunications (MOPT) in establishing an e-Government Projects Management Office (e-Liberia). One of the activities of the PMO is to develop and implement an e-Government web portal (e-Liberia) for the purpose of putting government services online.

The MOPT, in the second phase of the development of the e-Liberia portal, intends to deploy e-applications to improve service delivery to the public.

The Objective of this assignment is to design, develop, and deploy a database driven web-based e-Work Permit application to enable the public to process work permit applications online through the Liberia Ministry of Labor.

The scope of work requires;

- Development and deployment of web base application for Ministry of Labor in collaboration with MOPT.
- Training of designated staff to manage the web- base application

The short listing criteria are that Individuals (“Consultants”) shall have experience in:

- Excellent knowledge of and at least three (3) years’ demonstrated experience working with a wide range of web application development tools;
- Excellent knowledge of and demonstrated experience working with Web Technologies & Languages (PHP, Javascript, AJAX, jQuery, C#, ASP.Net, CSS, HTML, XML, XSLT);
- Excellent knowledge of and demonstrated experience working with Content Management Systems and Business Decision Support Applications (Dashboards/ Portals);
- At least 3 years’ experience with Software Development projects;
- Understanding and experience with database design and databases;
- Ability to provide user training;
- Ability to provide technical (ie. API) documentation;
- Good writing skills and experience with end user documentation;

The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to paragraph 1.9 of the World Bank’s Guidelines: Selection and Employment of Consultants [under IBRD Loans and IDA Credits & Grants] by World Bank Borrowers , January 2011 (“Consultant Guidelines”), setting forth the World Bank’s policy on conflict of interest.

A Consultant will be selected in accordance with the Individual Consultants Selection (ICS) method set out in the Consultant Guidelines. Firms may propose individuals, but selection will be based only on the qualifications of the individuals and the contract will be signed with the individual.
