EXTENSION OF PUBLIC CONSULTATION ON SATELLITE COMMUNICATIONS GUIDELINES

June 8, 2026

The Liberia Telecommunications Authority (LTA), pursuant to Part III Section 11(4) of the Telecommunications Act 2007 (the Act) and in compliance with the Consultation Guidelines, 2009, hereby gives notice of the extension of the consultation period to allow stakeholders to provide written feedback, inputs and comments on the revised draft Satellite Communications Guidelines (LTA-GL-002-2026), hereafter referred to as Guidelines.

Whereas,

1. On February 23, 2026, the LTA published a Public Consultation Document inviting stakeholders to submit written feedback, inputs and comments on the draft Guidelines by March 9, 2026;
2. On March 5, 2026 and May 29, 2026, the LTA convened public consultation forums with licensed telecommunications service providers on the draft Guidelines;
3. On April 3, 2026, the LTA published a Consultation Matrix of its responses to stakeholders' written feedback, inputs and comments along with the revised draft Guidelines, which were updated to reflect stakeholders' inputs as appropriate. LTA further requested stakeholders to submit any additional feedback by 5 pm GMT on April 8, 2026;
4. The LTA received no further feedback from stakeholders on the revised draft Guidelines as of 5pm GMT, April 8, 2026;
5. Following an internal review to ensure the Guidelines are fit-for-purpose for emerging satellite technologies, the LTA has revised the draft Guidelines as follows:
 - 5.1. Sections 2.4 and 2.6 have been revised to require SNOs to apply for and receive Landing Rights Authorization to utilize specific radio frequencies to deliver capacity into Liberia.
 - 5.2 Section 2.5 has been revised to require annual reporting by SNOs.
 - 5.3 Section 2.7 revised to include requirements for SNOs serving ESIMs temporarily operating in Liberia.
 - 5.4 Part IV has been introduced, informing concerned stakeholders that breach of any provisions of the Guidelines would be subject to remedial actions as appropriate.
 - 5.5 Part V has been revised, establishing a transitional period before the Guidelines become effective and citing conditions and procedures that would apply should the LTA decide to review, revise or amend the Guidelines.
6. The LTA has drafted and intends to annex the following documents to the Guidelines:
 - a. Application Form for Landing Rights Authorization
 - b. Application Requirements for Landing Rights Authorization



Now, therefore, the LTA gives Notice of the following:

- 7. That the extension of the consultation period will run from June 8, 2026, to 5 pm GMT on June 19, 2026.
- 8. That Stakeholders are invited to submit written comments/inputs (with justifications) to CONSULT@LTA.GOV.LR no later than 5 pm GMT on June 19, 2026. The LTA will only take account of comments received within this period.
- 9. That the LTA will publish a Report of comments received and its responses thereto, in whole or in part. Respondents should clearly indicate any confidential information contained in their responses. The LTA will deal with such information in accordance with its Regulations on Confidentiality (LTA-REG-0002).
