



LTA-ORDER: 0022-06-30-2026

REVOCATION ORDER

OF

**STARCELL INTERNATIONAL LIBERIA'S UNIVERSAL
TELECOMMUNICATIONS LICENSE AND SPECTRUM
AUTHORIZATION**

(LTA-UTL/STARCELL INTL COMPANY-03202020-001)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Part III Section 11, Part IV Section 20, and Part VI Section 24 and 25 of the Telecommunications Act 2007, the Liberia Telecommunications Authority (LTA) is vested with the authority to regulate telecommunications services, issue, suspend and revoke licenses and spectrum authorizations, as well as ensure compliance with applicable laws, regulations and license conditions;

WHEREAS, the LTA issued a Universal Telecommunications License and Spectrum Authorization to Starcell International Liberia (Starcell) in March 2020, subject to the terms, conditions and obligations contained therein;

WHEREAS, the LTA determined that Starcell committed material breaches of its License and Spectrum Authorization, including but not limited to:

- a. Failure to commence telecommunications operations within Liberia in a reasonable period following the issuance of its license as required under *Section 9.1 II*;
- b. Failure to satisfy its financial obligations as required under *Sections 3.1 and 4.1*;
- c. Failure to make annual contributions to the Universal Access Fund as required under *Section 3.6*;
- d. Failure to comply with the Regulations of the LTA and other applicable laws and regulatory requirements;
- e. Failure to respond satisfactorily to multiple regulatory directives and notices issued by the LTA;

WHEREAS, the failure of Starcell to operate created a gap in the availability of service to consumers, while Starcell possession of assigned spectrum and frequencies has impeded on the regulatory space available for the LTA;

WHEREAS, by LTA Order No. 0021-02-04-2026 dated February 4, 2026, the LTA suspended Starcell's Universal Telecommunications License and Spectrum Authorization for a period of ninety (90) days commencing February 9, 2026, and ending May 10, 2026, and expressly directed Starcell to remedy the identified breaches during the suspension period;

WHEREAS, the Suspension Order further provided that failure to remedy the breaches during the suspension period would result in the revocation of Starcell's License and Spectrum Authorization with immediate effect;

WHEREAS, upon expiration of the suspension period, Starcell has neither communicated with the LTA or taken any steps to remedy the breaches identified in the Suspension Order;

WHEREAS, the LTA has determined that this failure, Starcell has failed to remedy the breaches identified in the Suspension Order and remains non-compliant with the terms and conditions of its License and Spectrum Authorization;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

I. REVOCATION

That the Universal Telecommunications License and Spectrum Authorization issued to Starcell International Liberia under License Reference No. LTA-UTL/STARCELL INTL COMPANY-03202020-001 are hereby **REVOKED** with immediate effect.

II. TERMINATION OF RIGHTS

Upon the effective date of this Order:

- i. Starcell shall cease to possess any rights, privileges, interests, or entitlements arising from the License and Spectrum Authorization.
- ii. All frequencies, spectrum assignments, numbering resources and related regulatory privileges previously assigned to Starcell shall immediately revert to the Liberia Telecommunications Authority.
- iii. Starcell shall henceforth not represent itself as a licensed telecommunications operator or service provider in Liberia.

III. ENFORCEMENT

That the relevant departments of the LTA are hereby directed to take all necessary administrative and regulatory measures to implement this Revocation Order, including updating the Authority's licensing records and recovering any assigned spectrum resources.

IV. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Revocation Order shall take effect immediately upon signing and publication.

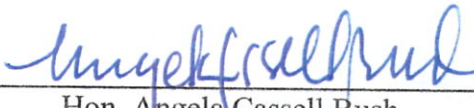

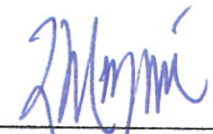
